

The Prismatic Debussy Four Festival Lectures

Join us at the Eastman School of Music as we explore the life, times, influences, effects, and most of all, the creative life of a composer who unlocked the freedom of music composition for the entire 20th century. Our course will complement the performances during the composer's sesquicentenary celebrations at Eastman's *The Prismatic Debussy* festival from October 13 - 26, 2012.

The Prismatic Debussy: A Festival Introduction is a four session series of talks that will take us through the life, music, and extra musical influences that shaped the world of Claude-Achille Debussy. Special performances, mixed media presentations, guests, and pre-concert refreshments are all part of the mix, and will be hosted by Mark Powell of the Institute for Music Leadership and the Eastman Community Music School.

Lecturer Biography

Mark Powell is the music director emeritus of ARCO the American Radio Chamber Orchestra and a Ford Foundation Award winning conductor. Since his Concertgebouw debut with the Netherlands Radio Symphony, he has conducted the Fort Worth, Cleveland Chamber, Moscow Symphony, Moores Opera Center, Netherlands Radio Chamber, Korsholm Music Festival, and Rochester Philharmonic Orchestras. He's been heard nationally on NPR as the long time host of



Live from Festival Hill, founded Houston's Discovery Series at the Hobby Center for the Performing Arts, and now serves on the faculty of Eastman's Institute for Music Leadership as well as the Eastman Community Music School.

His talks for the Houston Symphony, Da Camera, Society for the Performing Arts, Uniquely Houston, the University of Texas School of Public Health, the Association of Fundraising Professionals, the Houston Arts Alliance, and myriad other entities have placed him in demand as both a host and interlocutor for live and recorded performances. Now a member of the Eastman Rochester community, he makes his home in Victor, New York. In 2013 he assumes the artistic leadership of Da Camera New York.
