 $^{^2}$ Students concurrently pursuing a DMA, may take TH 401 to satisfy this requirement. Other students should register for a Theory course 401 or above that focuses on common-practice tonal analysis.

³ Elective units must include three (3) units in music theory and three (3) units outside of music theory. Courses must be at the 200-level or higher, and may include applied music. Arts Leadership (ALC) courses do not count towards the required units for the degree.

⁴ Students are required to register for their teaching recital, much as they would register for other classes, normally in the fall of their second year. Students should register for TH 470 Teaching Recital, normally during the same semester as TH 471. There is no charge for this registration, and a faculty signature is not required. Students may add or drop their recital registration online, or by completing a "Schedule Change Request" form in the Registrar's Office. No penalty will be assessed for late recital registration, which is permitted at any time. Once reported by the student's department chair as approved, the recital will appear on the official transcript with a grade of "S" for satisfactory. The evaluating committee will also inform the student of the outcome of his/her teaching recital after it is concluded. If necessary, a teaching recital may be repeated one time.
