DESCRIPTION OF COLLECTION

Shelf location: M2B, 8, 2-3 Physical extent: 1 linear foot

Provenance

The collection was assembled by Sibley Music Library staff from items housed independently.

Scope and Content

The collection is comprised of some three dozen music books written for children. The majority of items are collections of children's songs (e.g., nursery rhymes and folk songs). Also included in the collection are a small number of music instruction books, stories with music, sheet music, and cantatas for young performers; one item, a children's biography of J. S. Bach, contains no music. Many of the items were expressly intended for formal instruction or music appreciation classes (e.g., beginning instruction books; stories with music to use in classes; easy cantatas and songs). Most of the books were published in the late 19th century and the first half of the 20th century.

Restrictions

None, save for the strictures of United States copyright law where applicable.

Associations


The Lottie Ellsworth Coit Collection and the Marie Erhart Pearson Collection each contain pedagogical materials assembled for instructional purposes within the Eastman School of Music's preparatory division during the mid-twentieth century.

Several similar items are available in Sibley's circulating collection, including multiple school songbooks by Thaddeus P. Giddings, three song collections by Eleanor Smith, additional volumes by Lottie Ellsworth Coit, and assorted children's instruction books and song collections. There are also some relevant items within the rare books holdings, such as children's music by George F. Root, Jessie Gaynor's three-volume series *Songs of the Child World*, folk song collections by French music publisher Jean-Baptiste Wekerlin, and various collections of nursery rhymes with music. Additionally, the library recently received a small donation of books from Thelma Biracree Schnepel's personal library; among these items are several children's books that retell stories from various well-known ballets, often with illustrations (e.g., Petrushka, Scheherazade, Sleeping Beauty).

DESCRIPTION OF SERIES

Series 1: Printed music

The volumes in this series consist of children's songbooks and collections, plays with music, instructional methods, and other music publications intended for use with or by children. The items have been arranged alphabetically by title.
