

## ERIC EWAZEN

#### Eric D. Ewazen '76E

Eric Ewazen's music has been performed by distinguished soloists, chamber ensembles, vocalists, wind ensembles, and orchestras around the world. His music can be heard on close to 70 commercially released CDs, by some of the finest recording artists of the 20th and 21st centuries. He has been a guest at more than 150 colleges and universities worldwide, including 19 different countries and 47 of the 50 United States.

Dr. Ewazen received his Bachelor of Music degree from the Eastman School of Music in 1976, where his composition teachers included Samuel Adler, Warren Benson, Eugene Kurtz, and Joseph Schwantner, and his piano teacher was Barry Snyder. He received his master's and doctorate degrees from The Juilliard School in 1978 and 1980, where he was a student of Milton Babbitt. In the summer of 1978, he was also a student of Gunther Schuller at Tanglewood.

Dr. Ewazen has been a faculty member of The Juilliard School since 1980, teaching Music Theory in the College Division and Composition in the Pre-College Division. He was vice president of the League of Composers-ISCM and composer-in-residence with the Orchestra of St. Luke's in NYC.

In 2015, his music has been performed by the Colorado Symphony Orchestra, the Boise Philharmonic, the Anchorage Symphony, the Master-Works Festival Orchestra of Indiana, the ShenZhen Symphony in China, and the Isis Chamber Orchestra in London where Dame Evelyn Glennie played his marimba concerto. During the summer of 2015, he was the composer-in-residence with the Jeju Festival of Winds in South Korea and SliderAsia in Hong Kong. He also was a featured guest composer with the International Trombone Association Convention in Valencia, Spain, and the Stavanger Conservatory in Norway. In the U.S., he was a composer-in-residence at the Atlantic Music Festival in Maine, and with the Imani Winds Summer Music Festival in NYC.

During the 2015-2016 season, Eric Ewazen's Double Concerto for Violin and Cello will be premiered by the Anchorage Symphony, and the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra will be performing his Bass Trombone Concerto.

The Buffalo Philharmonic just released a CD featuring his Triple Concerto for Three Trombones and Orchestra. During the late winter and spring of 2016, Albany Records will be releasing four CDs of his music: a CD of

his chamber music featuring brass with the musicians from the Orquesta Sinfónica de Tenerife, a CD of his piano music, a CD featuring his trumpet music, and a CD featuring the chamber musicians from the Colorado Symphony.

Dr. Ewazen is particularly delighted to be receiving the Distinguished Alumni Award during Meliora Weekend at Eastman. He considers Eastman his beloved alma mater from which his entire career has grown. The extraordinary teaching, the lifelong friends he made, and the tremendous world of music to which he was introduced at the school have resonated with him ever since, and are a crucial part of his career as a composer, pianist, and teacher. He is forever grateful to Eastman for this exciting lifetime of music.
